Dear Pastor and Church Family,

August 15th marked the 70th anniversary of Korea's liberation from the Japanese empire. Japan occupied the Korean peninsula from 1910 to 1945. During this time, the government of Japan sought to destroy Korean society and culture. The freedoms of Korean people were greatly restricted and many suffered barbaric treatment at the hands of the Japanese. Though great damage was done, the spirit of the Korean people was not broken. Today, one can hardly tell that Korea was once a Japanese colony. Many of the historic buildings have been rebuilt and there is a great sense of patriotism among the Korean people. South Korea's economy is now ranked thirteenth in the world.

No longer an impoverished country, South Korea enjoys the status of being a developed nation. Things certainly have changed there for the better in the last 70 years, as far as material prosperity is concerned. There is, however, an ever growing need for the truth of Christ's Gospel to be communicated to the Korean people. Though roughly 18% of the population claim to be Protestant, most churches in South Korea do not biblically preach the Gospel. Furthermore, the majority of the population is comprised of Atheists, Buddhists, Catholics, and Shamanists. Sadly, most Koreans have never had the opportunity to hear a clear presentation of the Gospel. It is our desire to return to Korea and begin fervently communicating the Gospel of Christ to the Korean people through the power of the Holy Spirit.
