Last month, our daughter JoAnn celebrated her 100th day of life. In Korea, the 100th day of a child's life is a special occasion that is celebrated in a traditional way. We enjoyed this opportunity to reflect on how much the Lord has blessed us through our precious daughter. Sarah and I continue to attend Korean language classes at a nearby academy which has helped a great deal with our learning. I start full-time language study at the local university on Monday. We are excited about gaining proficiency in Korean so that we may someday soon communicate the Gospel verbally to those around us. Meanwhile, it is a blessing to be able to distribute Gospel tracts together as a family on the busy sidewalks of our city. We are so glad to be serving the Lord here in Korea.

Twice a week, I have the privilege to go out witnessing with the assistant pastor and another staff man from our church. We are often able to distribute a large number of Gospel tracts and sometimes we are able to engage people in conversation. Our goal is to present the Gospel of Jesus Christ to anyone willing to listen. Recently, as we were going out, I was reminded of the spiritual condition of the people the Lord has called us to. We gave a tract to a boy who was about ten years old, and asked him if he knew of Jesus Christ. He responded, "Jesus? I don't know who that is." This boy had no knowledge of our Lord and Savior! He then agreed to give the tract to his parents when he arrived home. As we continued down the street, we approached an elderly grandmother. She told us that she goes to "church" and prays often, but as we talked with her it became evident that she had no understanding of biblical salvation. When we tried to explain the simplicity of the true Gospel to her, she would not even take our tract. Both of these people, despite the difference in religious background, are currently

destined for the same awful eternal judgement unless they turn to Christ alone for salvation. This experience is a common example of the spiritual condition of our city's population. The vast majority have never clearly heard the true Gospel. Many people do not even know of the Christ we serve and some are blinded by false "gospels" and even false "christs". These dear people live in spiritual darkness. They must be personally engaged with the true Gospel of Christ while there is still time. We desire to be filled with the Holy Spirit and to be an effective, fervent witness for God's glory among the Korean people in these last days.
