We hope that you all are well and abounding in the work of the Lord. It is such a privilege to serve our Savior. We are so grateful for His provision and guidance in our lives. Continued language study, Gospel tract distribution, and preparation for church-planting have been the focus of our time this past month. Sarah continues to attend private Korean classes and I will start my fourth semester of Korean language study at the university next week. Last semester, on the final day of class, I gave my professor a small gift and one of our Gospel tracts. I included a note (in Korean) thanking her and introducing the tract to her. We pray that she would read the Scriptures, meditate on them, and perhaps be open to further discussion. We certainly need great wisdom as we seek to minister to those the Lord puts in our path.

Over the past months, while studying Korean at the university, I have developed a friendship with a classmate from China. As we would converse together between classes, I was able to present the Gospel to him and plant some Scriptural "seeds" from time to time. Before he returned to China, we invited Lee Bin to our home and shared the Gospel with him in depth using English and Korean. We also gave him a thorough Chinese Gospel tract which he read. Like so many young people here in the Far East (China, Korea, Japan, Taiwan, etc.) with an atheistic background, Lee Bin was initially skeptical. After answering some of his objections, I asked him this question: "If the Gospel were really true, would you consider turning to Christ for salvation?" He answered "Yes, I would". I then implored him to think deeply about the Scriptures that he had heard and read, which he agreed to do. Please pray for Lee Bin to come to Christ and be saved.



In closing, here are two additional prayer requests. We have an appointment with the immigration office next week (September 3rd) to extend our visas. Please pray that this process would go smoothly. Also, Sarah's father was recently diagnosed with stage one lung cancer. His surgery is scheduled for September 14th. We are praying that the Lord's will be done, for the cancer not to spread, for the surgery to be successful, and for grace to accept the Lord's will. Though our hearts desire healing, we truly want the Lord's perfect will to be accomplished. Thank you for praying with us! We are honored to be partnered with you for the sake of the Gospel going forth to the Korean people.
