



Dear Pastor and Church Family,

We hope you are well and experiencing the wonderful blessings that come from serving the Lord. We are so grateful for your faithful partnership with us as we labor to faithfully communicate the Gospel and lead Korean people to the Lord Jesus Christ here in our mission field of Busan, Korea. At the beginning of February, we had 30,000 more copies of our Gospel tract printed. We pray that these tracts, which are designed to thoroughly present the truth to those without any type of Christian background, would be used by the Lord to do a work in the hearts of those who will receive them. As I distributed these Gospel tracts at various points around our city last month, I was reminded again and again of the great need in our city. So many are blinded by materialism, false religion, and the corrupt spirit of the age. There seem to be so few that are open to considering the truth. Yet, each person I encounter is a precious soul whom our Lord loves and desires to save. We are praying that the Lord would expand our outreach here in Busan and help us to make more personal connections with lost souls. Thank you so much for faithfully praying for Jungbu Independent Baptist Church. Last month, several people contacted me and inquired about our church, including three different people who did so after first receiving a Gospel tract from us. By the grace of God, we welcomed several first-time visitors to our services as well. One lady came to a Wednesday night Bible study several weeks after receiving a tract. She listened intently as the Gospel was preached. We pray that she will return, hear the Gospel again, and experience the life-changing miracle of salvation. At the beginning of February, a family from a national pastor friend's church located in the western part of Korea visited our church while on vacation, bringing the wife's parents along with them. The husband called me a few days prior and asked me to share the Gospel with his father-in-law who is a believer in a religion called *Taegeukdo*. This false religion is based on several "eastern" religious concepts and was founded in Korea many decades ago. While the number of adherents is quite small, the complex myths and false teachings of this cult captivate the minds of those deceived by them. On the Sunday that the family visited our church, I preached from Romans 1:20 and used numerous other Scripture verses to implore the unsaved father-in-law to reevaluate the veracity of his beliefs and seriously consider the exclusive claims of Jesus Christ. The man seemed to listen well to the truth that was shared with him. At his son-in-law's request I again shared the Gospel with him after the service. At the close of our conversation, he indicated that he was not interested in further discussion at that time but thanked me for talking with him. We praise the Lord for sovereignly orchestrating this special opportunity to share the Gospel with a precious lost soul who would not be ordinarily inclined to come to church. May the seed planted that day result in this dear man's salvation. Thank you for praying for our family as we seek to obey God's call and serve Him here. By the Lord's mercy and grace, we are doing well. JoAnn, Hannah, and Anna are growing up quickly and learning more each day. Sarah and I count raising them as our greatest privilege. With the Constitutional Court expected to rule next month on whether to uphold the National Assembly's decision to impeach President Yoon (who suddenly declared martial law back in December), we continue to pray for the Lord's will to be done in the midst of the political chaos plaguing Korea. Various political forces are jockeying for power and control. Fringe elements on both sides of the political spectrum have captivated the hearts of many here and some have fallen prey to strong delusions. No matter what the court decides concerning the status of the president, the current volatile situation may lead to civil unrest across the country in the coming days. Regardless of what happens, it is our earnest prayer that our freedom to minister and preach the Gospel here in Busan would not be impeded. Thank you so much for praying with us. Your faithful prayers and sacrificial financial support are such a blessing to our family!
